Welcome Home envisions a community who works together to provide all people the opportunity to live life fully in the face of serious illness or death through compassionate care, reconciled relationships and restored dignity

Many people do not realize Hospice care takes place in a person's home, but if there is no home or relative to take care of them, and they are homeless, where do they go? This is where Welcome Home has come in to help fill this gap. Their doors are open 365 days a year and medical help 24-hours a day.

In October 2021, Welcome Home moved to a new renovated home, located on 4.7 acres of beautiful wooded property in East Chattanooga. By the end of 2022, they will be able to serve 10 residents at one time.

Welcome Home believes all of us should work together to meet the need of our most vulnerable neighbors, they need our love and support.
